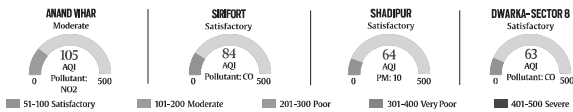

## OVER 15,000 SAMPLES COLLECTED ACROSS 11 DISTRICTS Secord sero survey suggests 28% in city have antibodies

THE SECOND round of serological survey, conducted in the first week of August across the national capital, has suggested that 28.35% of the people tested have developed antibodies against the novel coronavirus, it is learnt.

During the survey, more than 15,000 samples were lifted across 11 districts in Delhi to assess the spread of the virus. The samples were processed in 18 labs authorised by the state government for the rigorous exercise.

The data collated by researchers at Maulana Azad Medical College has been submitted to Principal Health Secretary Vikram Dev Dutt.

"The labs have submitted their reports and, after compiling the data, we have found a

prevalence of 28.35% of the disease among people who were tested in the second round. The highest prevalence has been reported from the central district," said a senior official from the state health department.

In July, Delhi Health Minister Satyendra Jain had announced that district health officials will carry out a sero survey across the national capital from the 1st till the 5th of every month. He

had said the exercise will help the government to identify the spread of the disease and to formulate policies for containment and management of the disease.

The decision was taken after the Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare announced the results of the first such survey carried out in the capital.

The previous serological survey carried out by the

National Centre for Disease Control on a sample size of 21,387 showed that 22.86% of the people surveyed had been exposed to the virus. A serological survey involves collecting blood samples to determine whether a person has developed antibodies against the virus.

"We have already started the work on the next survey and a meeting is scheduled for August 20 to discuss the sample size," added the official.

On Tuesday, Delhi recorded 1,374 coronavirus cases and 12 deaths, taking the total case count to 1,54,714, while the death toll mounted to 4,226.

As many as 1,146 people have recovered and been discharged from hospitals, officials said.

At 11,068, active cases saw a slight increase from Monday. Of these, 5,351 patients are under home isolation.

## Hit-and-run leaves traffic cop in coma

A 51-YEAR-OLD assistant sub-inspector of Delhi Traffic Police in an coma after he was hit by a car in West Delhi's Khyala on Monday evening.

Police said ASI Mahavir Yadav had signalled the driver to stop for checking at a police picket in Raghubi Nagar. However, the errand driver sped up and hit the ASI. ASI Yadav suffered severe injuries and is in a coma. He has been admitted to Sir Balaji Action Hospital in Punjabi Bagh," said Deepak Purohit, DCP (West).

Purohit at the spot noted down the first two digits of the car's registration number and are scanning CCTV footage to identify and arrest the driver.

The incident took place when ASI Yadav, along with other traffic police personnel, was posted at the police picket. "Around 5:30 pm, the ASI signalled to a white i20 car to halt for checking. Instead of stopping, the driver sped up and hit the ASI," said a senior police officer.

ASI Yadav was taken to the hospital by his colleagues who also informed his son, a sub-inspector with the Special Staff of West district. "I was in office when my father's colleagues informed me about the incident. I immediately rushed to the spot and got to know that his condition is critical. I last saw my father before he left for work in the morning," said his son Kuldeep Yadav.

## BJP says will go ahead with Ramlila this yr, but a leaner version

THE BJP's Delhi unit and the RSS have decided to go ahead with Ramlila celebrations in the national capital this year, saying that they will take precautionary measures due to the Covid pandemic.

The decision was taken in a meeting at the Jhandewalan temple auditorium on Tuesday, attended by state president Adesh Gupta, Delhi head of RSS Kulbushan Ahuja and members of prominent Ramlila committees.

Gupta said, "Many suggestions have been received regarding the staging of Ramlila... we felt it should be staged with fewer people in the audience, as was seen at the Independence Day event at Red Fort. It will be put up for a short time, and guidelines and precautionary measures in place due to Covid will be followed. It can also be broadcast online."

"Staging of Ramlila should not stop; the Delhi BJP will engage in talks at the administrative or state level. I want to assure you that Delhi BJP stands with all the Ramlila committees," he said.

Several BJP leaders like media department in-charge Ashok

Last year, Ramlila events across the capital were attended by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal and Congress president Sonia Gandhi.

## Cyclist dies after being hit by car, woman held

DELHI POLICE have arrested a 20-year-old woman, daughter of a South Delhi-based restaurant owner, for allegedly hitting a cyclist with her car in Huz Khas. The woman, a student of a private institute, took the victim to AIIMS in her car but left the hospital afterwards.

Police said the incident took place near Jai Bai College on Friday evening when the victim, security guard Farooq Ahmed (33), was heading for night shift on his cycle.

"The woman, with the help of a passerby, took the victim to AIIMS from where she left. Ahmed died during the course of treatment on Saturday evening," a senior police officer said.

Police scanned CCTV footage and identified the car, a Honda Amaze.

"The woman was returning home after meeting a friend. She was arrested from her house in Greater Kailash and has been released on bail. Her car has been seized," an officer said.

The security guard lived in Jasola Vihar and is survived by his wife and two children, an 8-year-old and a daughter aged seven.

## 50-year-old policeman dies of Covid, his family has to see cremation on video call

ON TUESDAY morning, when Aruna Sharma got a call that her husband Inspector Sanjay Sharma (50) had passed away at the Indian Spinal Injuries Centre, three days after testing positive for Covid, she knew she had to solely rely on the Delhi Police and her husband's colleagues for the cremation.

Aruna and the couple's 20-year-old son tested positive for the virus along with Inspector Sharma, and are under quarantine at their home in Vasant Kunj. "We couldn't even attend the cremation, and had to watch my husband's last rites on a WhatsApp video call," she said.

Inspector Sharma joined the

force in 1997. He was deployed in the south zone of the PCR unit, and is the 16th Delhi Police personnel to have succumbed to Covid-19. DCP/PCR/Shaar Sinha said, "He passed away Tuesday morning at a Vasant Kunj hospital. I was personally monitoring the situation. Our Covid-19 recover-

ered staff donated plasma and we assisted his family in whatever way we could, yet we couldn't save him. He was a good officer."

In 10 days, Sharma would have turned 51 years old. He is survived by his wife and their son, who studies at IIT-Delhi.

Aruna said, "He was hale and hearty, a teetotaler, a non-smoker, with no co-morbidities. On August 7, he was on special night patrolling duty as a part of the pre-Independence Day preparation. He returned home and complained of a headache. He had been very cautious and wore a mask, face shield, his vehicle was sanitised properly but still there was risk in the duty. He recalled how one of his unit boys

was residing in an area near Chhattarpur, which was in the red zone, and was unable to go home due to barricades. Sanjay helped him out there... We don't know how he got the virus, we guessed that maybe it was there."

She said that over the next few days, Sharma went to the dispensary nearby and got medicines. On August 12, he developed fever and cough and was rushed to the hospital on Independence Day.

"His oxygen levels were very low. The next day, he video-called me and told me he is okay... Two days later, he is no more. His friends and colleagues in the force did his last rites," she said.

**PUBLIC NOTICE**  
 Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide orders dated 10.08.2020 has directed that RFID System should be implemented at all the remaining entry points of Delhi. Consequently the Chairman EPCA vide minutes of meeting dated 14.08.2020 has directed that the timeline for the installation of RFID System at the remaining toll plaza is 31.01.2021 and by November-2020 all the toll plaza will get handovered machine. It was also decided that the penalty of charging double the amount from vehicles not having RFID Tag or adequate balance in the tag is waived off till 15.10.2020 due to Covid-19 pandemic.

Meanwhile drivers/owners of all the specified commercial vehicles are requested to get their vehicles pre-registered for RFID tags/ recharge as the specified commercial vehicles shall not be allowed to enter into Delhi without RFID Tag/ sufficient recharge after 15.10.2020 and double penalty will be charged from violators.

Till now monthly passes were being issued from all Toll Plazas. Now it has been decided that monthly passes will be issued from RFID system either through online or from 13 RFID Toll Plazas.

RFID Tag can be obtained from 13 MCD toll plazas i.e., KGT (Kundli), Tikri Main, Aya Nagar, Rajpuri, Kapashera, Badarpur Sarai, Badarpur Main, Kalindi Kunj, DND Flyover, Gazipur Old, Gazipur Main, Shahdara Flyover, Shahdara Main Toll Plaza.

The RFID Tag can be recharged at above mentioned Toll Plazas or online by following process:

1. Download "MCD-Toll" mobile app from playstore; enter mobile no; you will receive OTP; enter OTP; your page will open; recharge using credit/debit card or net banking.
2. Go to [www.aactagsdcm.com](http://www.aactagsdcm.com) and then follow the same procedure.
3. Go to RFID Toll Plazas and recharge there by cash or credit/debit card etc.
