Airlines hit as Deepavali travel fails to take off

Fares on key metro routes are down by 30% at a time when it usually peaks

Deepavali is a time when most Indians spare no expense to be with their families. But not this year. The reluctance to spend on air travel this festival season has dampened celebrations and is making airlines nervous, who are forced to lower airfares to fill up their planes.

Data from the travel portal Yatra.com shows that fares on key metro routes are down by 30%, while this is usually a time airlines hike airfares due to a huge demand and are able to make up for losses piled up during the lean months of July, Au-

Data shows that airfares booked 15 days before the date of travel have dropped on Delhi to Chennai route by 44% from ₹5,571 last year to ₹3,071 this year, Delhi to Pune by 30% from ₹5,219 last year to ₹3,631 this year and 22% on Chennai-Delhi from ₹5,688 to ₹4,382.

The Hindu spoke to Minister of Civil Aviation Hardeep Singh Puri on this crisis in the aviation sector, and he said. "No, low fares are not due to an economic slowdown. Is any plane going empty, not at all. LCCs are competing against each other and dumbing down fares."

However, both the airline executives quoted above said that "competitive pricing is an outcome of demand".

"People are being more cautious than they have been in the past. But going by the prevailing last minute fare rise trends, we could expect a rise in fares as we get closer to the booking dates." said Yatra.com's Sharat Dhall



Services in some public sector banks were partially affected on Tuesday with two unions observing a nationwide one-day strike to protest against the Centre's proposed merger of banks and banking reforms.

The strike, called by the All-India Bank Employees Association (AIBEA) and the Bank Employees Federation of India (BEFI) saw the participation of 3 lakh employees and led to about 20 lakh banking instrument, inlcuding cheques worth around ₹15,000 crore not being cleared, AIBEA general secretary C.H. NEW DELHI The Alaknanda Hydropower Company (AHC) has taken the Union Water Ministry and the Uttarakhand State government to court following a 2018 notification by the National Mission for Clean Ganga (NMCG), a Union Water Ministry body, that requires hydropower companies located on the Ganga's tributaries to release more water than from previous

years. Located on the Alaknanda river – a major source river for the Ganga – the 330 MW project was commissioned in 2014 and is among the 19 hydropower projects functioning along various stretches of the Ganga and its
