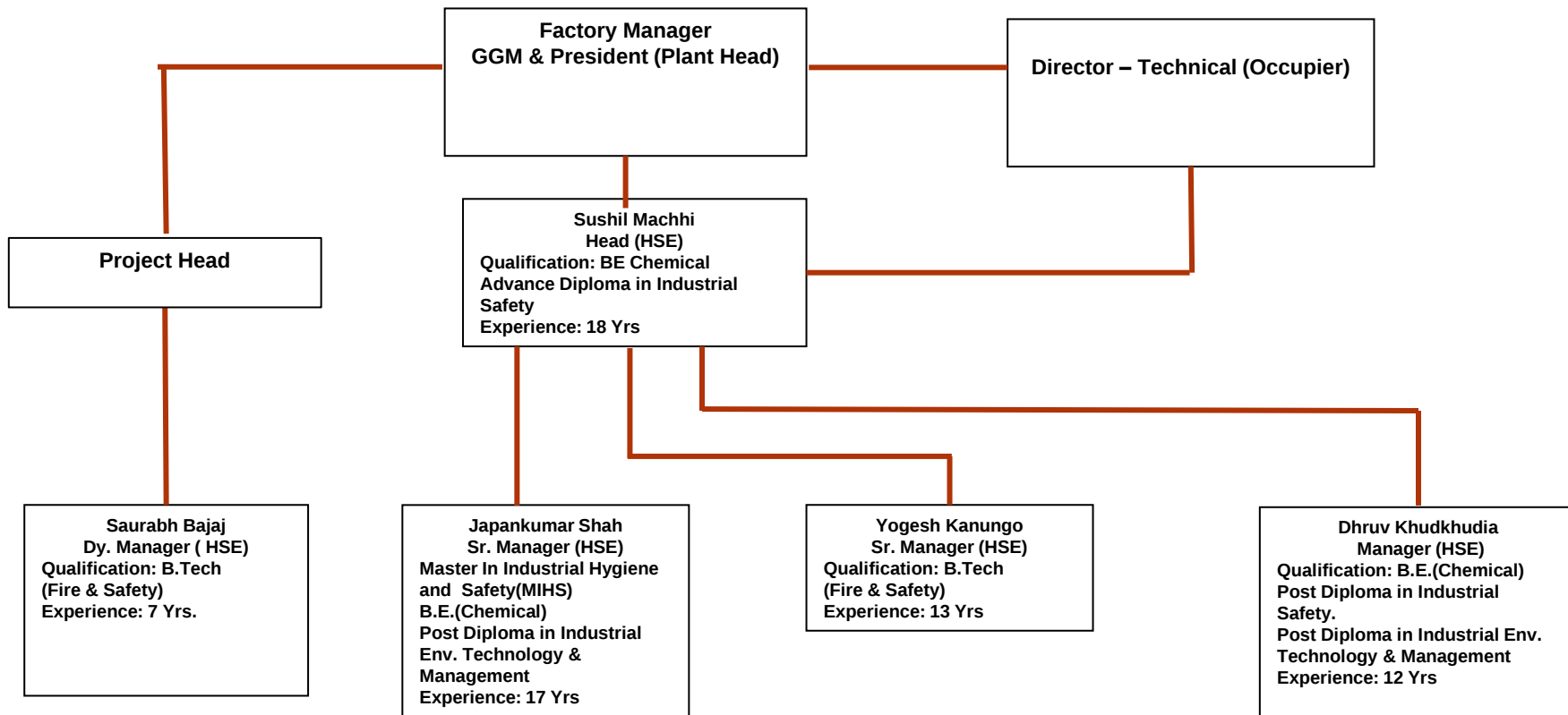

A WEEK after two cases of cheating were lodged against a former Ranji cricketer from Vadodara, Rishi Arothe, the Special Operations Group (SOG) of the city police on Wednesday arrested him from a hotel at Thane near Mumbai.

Inspector V S Patel of the SOG, said, "After two cases of cheating were filed against Rishi at Manjalpur and Raopura police stations, multiple police teams had fanned out to Bangalore, Goa and Mumbai to track him down."

"Based on technical surveillance and inputs from human sources, as well as by tracking the IP address, he was traced to a hotel in Thane. He was detained on March 12 (and brought to Vadodara) where he was formally arrested by Manjalpur police station on Wednesday," he added.

Following his arrest by the Manjalpur police in the case of cheating, his custody will be sought by the Raopura police in the second case, said police.

On March 5, Manialpur po-

lice station had booked Rishi and three others in an alleged case of criminal conspiracy and cheating a city-based businessman of Rs 29.5 lakh on the pretext of setting up a club in Goa.

The following day, an aspiring cricketer from Panchmahal district, had approached the Raopura police station in Vadodara and filed a complaint of cheating against Rishi stating that he had duped him of Rs

5.27 lakh by promising him a spot in the Indian Premier League. On March 4, the SOG had arrested Rishi's father Tushar Arothe – former coach of the India women's cricket team – after cash of Rs 1 crore was seized from his house at Pratapgunj in Vadodra. Investigation had revealed that he had sent the cash to his father from Nashik via an angadia service.

Protests, detentions mar public hearing for environmental clearance to copper plant

Hareesh Vora, Deputy Superintendent of Police of Savarkundla division in Amreli, said that protesters became "unruly", forcing police to intervene. "Despite repeated requests to not disturb others who wanted to make submissions at the hearing, the protesters continued their unruly behaviour and therefore we had to detain them so that the hearing could proceed as per law," Vora said. He added that the protesters were taken to the Rajula police station and that they were released after the hearing was over at 2:30 pm.

The IACL has sought clearance to set up an integrated copper and fertiliser plant on the land abutting coastal Lansapur and Lohpur villages of Jafrabad at an estimated cost of Rs 15,689 crore. The proposed plant is set to be the largest in Gujarat, as per the firm, having the capacity to produce 10 lakh tonnes of copper and 16.5 lakh tonnes of fertiliser annually. It will be the third copper smelter in the state after the 5-lakh-tonnes-per-annum (LTA) copper smelter of Hindalco in Dahej in Bharuch district and the newly set up 5 LTA smelter set up by Adani in Mundra in Kutch. The company proposes

to set up the plant on 161.5 hectares (ha). Meanwhile, local alleged that people interfered in the public hearing. "Copper smelters pollute air, land and water and the IACI, has hired executives under whose watch the Hindalco plant in Dahaj received 60 notices of flouting pollution norms. People want to protest against the plant as the company proposes to use old technologies for smelting copper and manufacturing fertiliser. Displaying banners is one way to protest. But police didn't allow that and kept officers constantly kept asking people to submit on one particular line only," Jaydeep Dhakad (26), a farmer from Chhatyadiya village adjoining Lathour, told the

Indian Express. As per the draft environment impact assessment (EIA) report submitted by the firm to the GPCB, the site of the proposed project is 26 km away from the boundary of Gir National Park and Wildlife Sanctuary -- the world's last abode for Asiatic lions. The firm said that lion movement was recorded at the site during the study to prepare the draft EIA.

There are several species of aquatic birds in this pond, which include Small Indian Cormorants, Indian Shags, Pond Herons, Spot-billed Ducks, Cotton Teals, Cochin Indian Reef Herons, White-breasted Water Hens, Kingfishers etc. For all the Schedule-I species reported within the study area, a site-specific Wildlife conservation

plan has been prepared by an External Expert agency and submitted to the Forest Department for approval," reads the draft BIA. The investment of Rs 1,302 crore for controlling pollution and recurring annual expenditure of Rs 218 crore for the same purpose.

Mehul Barasia, Sub-Divisional Officer, Forest Department, has argued in favour and against the proposed plan. "Around 35 people made oral submissions and 32 others made written submissions. Some people favoured the plan, while others felt it would be good for employment opportunities for the locals. However, others opposed, expressing apprehensions that it will be a polluting industry and that it will harm the environment," Barasia, who presided over the public hearing, said. Alkesh Rathod, regional officer of GPCB's office in Bhavnagar, said that IACI has submitted a wildlife management plan to the Gujarat Wildlife Department for clearance. "The company did submit a draft wildlife management plan to us but we sought details as to how the plan will be funded. The company is yet to respond to us," a senior forest officer said.

First-of-its kind sewage treatment unit unveiled in Vadodara

The GUJARAT Pollution Control Board (GPCB), in association with the Padra Industries Association and Farmers' Action Group, on Wednesday inaugurated a first-of-its-kind Unconventional Decentralized Multi-Stage Reactor (UDMSR) for sewage treatment in Luna village of Padra taluka of Vadodara. The unit will facilitate the treatment of sewage for agricultural purposes.

The 25 Kilolitre per day (KLD) UDMSR system installed in Luna is a pilot-scale project and will be

replicated in urban areas, said officials. The technology has been developed by Upendra Patel, a professor at the Civil Engineering Department, Faculty of Technology and Engineering of Maharashtra Sayajirao University. Patel holds a PhD in Environmental Science and Engineering from the Indian Institute of Technology (IIT), Mumbai. The GPCB signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Upendra Patel after a series of meetings with Rohit Pranjapati of Paryavaran Suraksha Samiti to install the UDMSR technology in Luna, officials added.

The pilot-scale UDMSR sys-

tem set up in the village Luna is designed to treat 25 KLD of sewage servicing a population of about 400-500 people. The design of UDSMR is modular in nature, which means that it can be modified easily to accommodate more flow in the future.

is also tested for up to two times the design flow capacity and its performance has been found to be very consistent," Patel said.

Patel added that the UDSMR can be used for the treatment of domestic sewage in rural areas. "The design of UDSMR is modular and each individual segment can be removed for cleaning/maintenance. Thus, the operation and maintenance of UDSMR do not require any daily computations or analyses, and hence, no skilled labor is required. The only energy requirement lies with the operation of pumps. In areas with a scarcity of electricity, solar panels may be installed

above the reactor. Thus, the UDSMR is a low-cost and reliable treatment system for domestic effluent requiring minimal energy and supervision," Patel added. Since 2011, groundwater contamination due to industrial effluent has been a cause of concern in Luna village, which is known for its drumstick production while Padra is considered the 'vegetable bowl' of the state.

"The UDSMR is currently a project to treat sewage water but we are also actively working on the issue of the effluent dumping and the groundwater contamination in the area," Prapajati said.

The cost of installation of the

nitrot plant ranges from Rs 35,000 to Rs 40,000 per KLD capacity as well as additional costs of electricity and operator salary and maintenance costs of pumps and equipment. Members of the Padra Industries Association assumed the responsibility for the installation of the system while a farmer living adjacent to the site was involved in the operation of the system.
