teers to bridge the gap in voter assistance. It requested the executive chairman of the Bihar State Legal Services Authority to issue directions by September 2 to notify paralegal volunteers at the district level, complete with names and mobile numbers, to help voters and parties file claims or objections online. These volunteers will route their reports through district judges, who will compile the data for the state legal services authority.

The RJD, in its application, asked the court to direct ECI to extend the claims period by two weeks, till September 15, citing the sharp rise in applications from excluded voters.

During the Monday hearing, advocate Prashant Bhushan and senior counsel Shob Alam, appearing for the RJD, pressed for an extension and argued that Aadhaar should be treated not just as proof of identity and residence but also as a declaration of citizenship. "This court said Aadhaar will also be accepted by ECI," said Bhushan, adding that transparency was lacking since uploaded documents were not publicly visible online.

The bench, however, retorted: "We cannot enhance the status of Aadhaar despite the legal pronouncements by the Constitution bench in the KS Puttaswamy judgment (2017) and Section 9 of the Aadhaar Act. Whatever value can be attached to Aadhaar statutorily, that has to be accepted." Section 9 states that Aadhaar is only proof of identity, and not of citizenship.

Dwivedi, representing ECI, reported that 99.5% of Bihar's 72.4 million electors had already filed at least one valid document. He added that notices were being issued within seven days wherever deficiencies were found. Dwivedi said, "By September 25, verification of documents will complete. We are issuing notices as and when any deficiency is being noted in the documents of proposed voters."

He also pointed out the low level of participation by political parties, noting that RJD had filed only 10 claims through booth-level agents, all of which were under process, while CPI (ML) had filed over 100 exclusions but "just a handful for inclusions." Out of the 6.5 million names excluded from the draft rolls, Dwivedi said, only about 33,000 individual inclusion forms and 25 from parties

had been submitted.

"What's really bothering us is -- parties could come up with only 120 cases?" the bench remarked.

While Bhushan alleged "the problem is with transparency," Dwivedi countered, "The problem is with the mindset and they want to disrupt."

Senior counsel Gopal Sankaranarayanan urged the court to clarify that Aadhaar could be submitted even by those receiving deficiency notices now, not just the 6.5 million initially excluded. The bench reiterated that Aadhaar "will have its value under the law and regulations" and asked petitioners to flag specific instances of non-compliance later.

With ECI assuring that the filing process would remain open in practice, the bench declined to extend the statutory deadline but sought to strengthen voter facilitation through paralegal assistance. It also directed political parties and petitioners to submit affidavits on issues raised in hearings, particularly on disputes around acceptance of claims and objections.

The order came after weeks of sparring in court over the special intensive revision (SIR) of Bihar's electoral rolls, which saw nearly 6.5 million names excluded in the draft rolls published last month. Opposition parties, including the RJD, have accused the Commission of disenfranchising voters and demanded more time for corrections, while ECI has defended the exercise as necessary after nearly two decades without intensive updating.

On August 22, the Supreme Court had clarified that claims could be filed using Aadhaar or any of the 11 approved identity documents, stressing that electoral roll preparation was "not a mere administrative formality but a process with direct implications for a citizen's franchise."

Despite appointing over 1.6 lakh booth-level agents, the bench had also noted that political parties filed only a handful

of claims, a fact that again drew sharp comment on Monday. "We would have appreciated that submission had the parties come up with thousands of forms. It is surprising that political parties are asking for exclusions," it observed after Alam argued that the number of claims have sharply increased after the August 22 order on applying with Aadhaar.

The controversy over SIR has emerged as a flashpoint ahead of the Bihar assembly elections later this year, with the INDIA bloc alleging an attempt to skew the rolls, and the Commission urging parties to "assist genuine voters instead of staging demonstrations."

PM MODI AT SCO

spoke, surrounded by translators, an apparent effort to convey solidarity.

Modi said India believes the three main pillars of SCO are security, connectivity and opportunity, but made the fight against terrorism the thrust of his address at the summit. India, which has been affected by terrorism for four decades, has consistently stressed the importance of unity in combating the menace, he said.

"Recently, we witnessed the most heinous face of terrorism in Pahalgalam... This attack was not only an assault on the conscience of India, but also an open challenge to every nation, and every individual who believes in humanity," he said. "In such circumstances, it is natural to ask: Can the open support for terrorism by certain countries ever be acceptable to us?"

Urging all SCO members to clearly and unanimously oppose double standards on terrorism, Modi said: "Together, we must oppose terrorism in every form and manifestation."

The Indian side said ahead of the summit, for which Modi travelled to China for the first time in seven years, that New Delhi expected strong condemnation of cross-border terror in the joint communique. This was the first time Modi and Sharif came face to face since four days of hostilities between India and Pakistan in May, triggered by Indian military strikes on terrorist infrastructure in retaliation for the Pahalgalam attack.

The SCO's Regional Anti-Terrorist Structure (SCO-RATS) played a key role in united efforts to counter terror and India took the initiative this

year to fight al-Qaeda and other terror groups linked to it by leading a "joint information operation", Modi said.

"We have also proposed enhanced coordination, and joint measures against radicalisation. We have raised our voice firmly against terror financing," he said.

The 10-member bloc listed its commitment to fight terrorism and extremism and urged the world community to combat the cross-border movement of terrorists in the Tianjin Declaration adopted at the conclusion of a two-day summit.

Modi also emphasised the SCO's role in cooperation for reforms of global institutions such as the United Nations and for boosting the development of the Global South.

"To confine the aspirations of the Global South to outdated frameworks is to deny justice to future generations. The colourful dreams of the new generation cannot be displayed on a black-and-white screen. It is time to change the screen," he said.

Noting that strong connectivity opens doors to trade and builds trust and development, Modi said India backs initiatives such as Chabahar port and the International North-South Transport Corridor to boost links with Afghanistan and Central Asia.

However, he cautioned that such ventures must respect sovereignty and territorial integrity -- an oblique reference to the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor that is opposed by India since it passes through Pakistan-occupied Kashmir.

"This is also enshrined in the basic principles of the SCO Charter. Connectivity that by-passes sovereignty loses trust and meaning," he said.

The SCO can also benefit from India's wide-ranging reforms, Modi said.

"This is opening up new opportunities for international cooperation along with development in the country. I invite all of you to join India's development journey," he added.

Chinese President Xi highlighted his vision for a new global security and economic order that prioritises the Global South, an apparent challenge to the US.

"We always stand on the side of international fairness and justice, champion inclusiveness and... oppose hegemonism and power politics, thus becoming a proactive force for world peace and development,"

he said, in a thinly veiled swipe at President Donald Trump's tariff policies.

Describing the SCO as the world's largest regional organisation with a combined economic output of almost \$30 trillion, Xi said the bloc's international influence and appeal are increasing.

"We should safeguard the UN-centred international system and support the multilateral trading system with the WTO at its core," he said.

Xi also announced China will implement 100 livelihood projects in SCO member states, provide RMB 2 billion yuan in grants to member states within 2025 and issue an additional RMB 10 billion yuan in loans to member banks of the SCO Interbank Consortium over three years.

Russian President Putin said the SCO brings together like-minded partners committed to "shaping a just, multipolar world order" and the bloc is laying the "political and socio-economic foundations for a new system of stability, security and peaceful development in Eurasia -- a system that would replace outdated Eurocentric and Euro-Atlantic models".

ing the 50% tariffs, an expected visit by an American delegation in August for talks to reach a free trade agreement was abruptly put off.

Five rounds of negotiations took place between March and July, with technical teams largely concluding the framework by late June. However, the talks remained deadlocked.

Trump's criticism of India follows comes even as senior aides and officials in Washington have increased public pressure on New Delhi.

White House deputy chief of staff Stephen Miller, Treasury Secretary Scott Bessent and senior trade adviser Peter Navarro have publicly criticised continued Indian purchases of oil from Russia.

Trump's displeasure with India's position on these issues -- as well as India denying that the intervention of the US president led to the cessation of hostilities with Pakistan in May -- have reportedly troubled the bilateral relationship.

According to reports in the US media, Trump no longer plans to travel to India for the Quad leaders' summit, which was scheduled to be held later this year.

Acquittal of criminals blot on criminal justice system, says top court

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Monday underscored that the criminal justice system must protect both sides of the equation -- ensuring no innocent is wrongly punished, but equally preventing culprits from walking free on the basis of "unreasonable doubts" and "misapplication of procedure".

"Every instance of acquittal of an actual culprit revolts against the sense of security of the society and acts as a blot on the criminal justice system," a two-judge bench held, while setting aside a Patna high court judgment that had acquitted two men convicted of raping a minor girl in Bihar's Bhogpur district.

The bench cautioned that the principle of "beyond reasonable doubt" was often misunderstood in trial and appellate courts, with minor inconsistencies and procedural lapses being elevated to a level that undermines substantive justice. "A reasonable doubt is one that renders the prosecution version improbable and establishes the existence of an alternate set of facts. It is a serious doubt which must be backed by reason," said the court, warning against "loose

acquittals" based on trivial discrepancies.

"The underlying foundation of the principle of beyond reasonable doubt is that no innocent should face punishment for a crime that he has not done. But a flip side of the same, of which we are conscious, is that at times, owing to a misapplication of this principle, actual culprits manage to find their way out of the clutches of law. Such misapplication of this principle, resulting into culprits walking free by taking benefit of doubt, is equally dangerous for the society," said the bench.

Reinstating the life terms awarded by the trial court, the top Court held that the Patna HC had erred in discarding a "fairly consistent and creditworthy case of the prosecution".

UNDER THE VEDIC CLOCK, EACH DAY COMPRISES OF 30 HOURS THAT ARE 48 MINUTES LONG

Under the Vedic Clock, each day comprises of 30 hours that are 48 minutes long.

The CM said that Indian scriptures calculate time with extraordinary precision -- one day is counted from sunrise to sunrise, divided into 30 "muhurats".

"Unlike the West, where dissent in time calculation once led to capital punishment, the Sanatan tradition has always encouraged open debate and diversity of thought," Yadav said.

NEW DELHI: Union education minister Dharmendra Pradhan on Monday praised National Council of Education Research and Training (NCERT) for releasing special modules on India's partition, Operation Sindoor and India's space journey, describing them as a step towards presenting the nation's history and achievements in the right perspective.

Addressing NCERT's 65th Foundation Day, Pradhan said the council is restoring the right perspective, adding that "a few intolerant people, bound by a colonial mindset and viewing India through a Western lens, are naturally uncomfortable with this."

Lauding the council's recent works, the education minister said NCERT has done "extremely commendable" work by including the saga of Operation Sindoor in school curricula and developing modules on the horrors of India's Partition.

"We should never forget the tragedy of Partition. If we don't understand our history in the context of the present, the future generations will be misguided," he said at the event.

VP POLLS: EC ASKS PB CEO TO ISSUE POSTAL BALLOT TO AMRITPAL SINGH

CHANDIGARH: Jailed Khadoor Sahib MP Amritpal Singh will cast his vote in the September 9 vice presidential election through postal ballot in Assam's Dibrugarh prison, according to a statement issued on Monday.

The Election Commission (EC) issued instructions for the facilitation of voting by Singh, who is also a member of the electoral college for the vice presidential election, the statement issued by the office of the Punjab chief electoral officer (CEO) said.

In accordance with the provisions of Rule 26 of the Presidential and Vice-Presidential Elections Rules, 1974, the EC has directed that a postal ballot paper be issued to Singh, the statement said.
