‘WANTED TO SAVE MY FACE, ACID FELL ON HANDS’

‘Stalker’ throws acid on 19-year-old DU student

AN ALLEGED stalker of a second-year Delhi University student threw acid on her in North West Delhi’s Ashok Vihar on Sunday, police said.

The police got a call from Deep Chand Bandhu Hospital. “The police were told that a 19-year-old woman, a resident of Delhi’s Mukundpur, was admitted with acid burn injuries,” DCP (North West) Bisham Singh said.

On the day of the incident, the victim, a student of School of Open Learning, was walking towards another college where she was taking extra classes, police said.

Three men arrived on a bike, the police said, adding that one of them was an acquaintance of the woman.

“The victim stated that she had gone to Laxmi Bai College in Ashok Vihar to attend extra classes. While she was walking towards the college, Jitender, a resident of Mukundpur, along with Ishan and Arman, arrived on

a motorcycle. Ishan allegedly handed over a bottle to Arman, who threw acid on her. The victim, in a bid to protect her face, sustained injuries on both hands. The accused fled the spot,” DCP Singh said.

“I just wanted to save my face. When they arrived, I spotted the bottle in their hand. I sensed something (wrong), and just covered my face with my bag. The acid fell on my hands, stomach... I screamed,” she said, flanked by her mother and her younger brother on either side, at the hospital.

“An elderly man came towards me, and took me to the hospital,” the woman added.

“The accused has not been arrested yet ... Doctors said it will take at least a week before they can further assess the (his sister’s) injury,” the brother said.

A police officer said that the woman had known Jitender for a long time. “They also had a heated argument about a month ago,” the officer said.

The victim said that Jitender, who is married and a father of two, had been following and

stalking her since over a year.

“I complained to his (Jitender) wife last month. Instead of talking to him, she put the blame on me. I got so scared that I stopped getting out of my house,” the victim added.

“The stalking had stopped in the past one month,” she also said.

Based on the statement of the victim, the police have registered a case and a probe is in progress.

The woman was shifted to the Ram Manohar Lohia Hospital and is currently under treatment, police also said.

The SFI condemned the incident, calling it “a reflection of systemic negligence and indifference” by authorities. The outfit demanded swift action against the perpetrators and “accountability” from DU and other officials.

The ABVP said it considers the attack extremely unfortunate and condemnable. “Such incidents in and around the university campus are a matter of serious concern from the perspective of the safety of female students,” it said.

DUSU members Aryan Mann and Deepika Jha also visited the victim in hospital.

60-year-old woman dies after being run over by SUV in Nangloi

A 60-YEAR-OLD woman died after an SUV allegedly ran over her in Outer Delhi’s Nangloi area on Sunday, the Delhi Police said.

According to the police, the incident happened around 8.30 am, when the woman was crossing the road near a wholesale flower market in Nangloi, also known as the Nangloi phool mandi.

“On reaching the spot the police came to know that the woman was crossing the road when a black Scorpio car hit her,

after which the driver fled with the car,” DCP (Outer) Sachin Sharma said.

The police said that some shopkeepers, who were eyewitnesses to the accident, alerted officers at Nangloi police station.

“The PCR received a call around 8.30 am. According to the caller, the vehicle sped off and people present in the area at the time of the incident were unable to note its registration number,” a police officer said.

Some bystanders took the women to Sanjay Gandhi Memorial Hospital in an auto rickshaw. The woman was later

recognised as Neema Devi.

“Neema Devi was a resident of Nasirpur. When officers reached the hospital, she was not in a state to give a statement. No eyewitness was found at the hospital,” DCP Sharma said.

Around 11 am, the police were informed that Neema succumbed to her injuries at the hospital, an officer said.

“A case under sections 281 (rash driving) and 106 (death by negligence) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita was registered at Nangloi police station. Further investigation is under progress,” DCP Sharma added.

Man caught with gold inside bottle cap upon arrival from Dubai

New Delhi: Customs department officers have foiled a smuggling bid — with the culprit this time having hidden gold inside the cap of a beverage bottle, officials said.

According to officials, an Indian passenger travelling from Dubai to Delhi on an Air India AI-996 flight on October 25 was intercepted at the green channel “after being discreetly followed based on profiling”. Upon inspection, officers discovered that the plastic cap of a beverage bottle had been tampered with to conceal a cylindrical piece of gold.

The gold was meticulously crafted to fit inside the cap, making it difficult to detect during regular checks. Customs officials said the gold, which was seized, weighed 170 grams.

Customs officials also said that on October 24, they seized 996.5 grams of gold worth Rs 1.17 crore from a foreign national who arrived in Delhi from Myanmar on flight 8M-620. The gold, shaped into six bars, was wrapped in brown tape and concealed in her undergarments. The passenger was arrested. **ENS**

Gangster who claimed responsibility for attack on rapper Fazilpuria held

MONTHS AFTER shots were fired at the car of Haryana rapper Rahul Fazilpuria near the Badshahpur section of Southern Peripheral Road (SPR) in Gurgaon, the Gurugram Police Sunday arrested the gangster, who allegedly plotted the attack, at Delhi’s Indira Gandhi International Airport.

Wanted criminal Sunil Sardhania, who is accused in multiple cases in Haryana and Uttar Pradesh, was living in Costa Rica with a fake passport, said officers.

Police said his movements were being traced and he was nabbed with the help of the Ministry of Home Affairs and Interpol. He was caught as he returned to India to allegedly perpetrate another crime.

“Using a fake passport under the name Suneel Singh, obtained from New Ashok Nagar and Vasundhara Enclave in Delhi, he fled to Dubai and then to Costa Rica in 2024. From abroad, he al-

legedly coordinated with accomplices to plan the attacks in Gurgaon, arranging shooters and weapons through intermediaries,” a police spokesperson said.

Inspector Anand Kumar, in-charge of the Sector 31 Crime Branch, led the operation that resulted in Sardhania’s arrest. The operation was supervised by ACP (Crime) Lalit Dalal and DCP (West) Karan Goel, said police.

Sardhania was in the news after he had claimed responsibility online for the shooting incident involving singer-rapper Rahul Fazilpuria on July 14.

Seven other suspects have so far been arrested in the Fazilpuria case.

PREGNANT COP LIFTS 145 KG AT NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

‘Don’t want pregnancy to be taken as a disease’

WHEN A Delhi Police constable, Sonika Yadav (31), stepped onto the platform at the All India Police Weightlifting Cluster 2025–26 in Andhra Pradesh on October 17, the crowd expected a routine powerlifting performance.

Many assumed she had moved up from her usual 65-kg category to 84 kgs after putting on some weight. But as she gripped the barbell for a 145-kg deadlift, jaws dropped as the realisation

dawned upon the spectators — she wasn’t just heavier, she was seven months pregnant.

“Come on, Soni!” — the

cheers rent the air. The constable, who took up powerlifting in 2023, proved that strength just isn’t physical. Back in May, she was lacing up her shoes for a gym session when she found out that she was pregnant. Her husband thought the pregnancy would mean a break from training, but Sonika had other plans.

“I don’t want pregnancy to be taken as a disease or something that stops women from doing something. It is normal and I wanted to set an example. Throughout my pregnancy, I lifted weights and geared up myself for

Priest held for killing wife, staging it as suicide

New Delhi: A priest has been arrested in North West Delhi for strangling his wife and staging it as a suicide, the police said on Sunday. The 11-year-old daughter of the couple was sleeping at the time of the incident, the police also said.

According to the police, the Keshav Puram police station received a call from the accused, identified as Dinesh Sharma, at

1.05 am on Sunday. “The caller said he had found his wife hanging in their apartment in Ganeshpura,” DCP (North West) Bisham Singh said.

When officers reached the spot, they found a woman lying on the floor, who was identified as Sushma Sharma, an officer said. Her husband Dinesh — a priest at a Shiv temple — was sitting beside her body and the couple’s daugh-

ter was sleeping in the bedroom.

No satisfactory evidence was found to support the husband’s claim of her suicide, police said. During questioning, Dinesh broke down and confessed to having killed his wife. He told the police that daily squabbles with the wife had triggered him. “The accused’s brother is the owner of the flat. He had been living there since the last 12-13 years,” the DCP said. **ENS**
